LETTER FROM THE PASTOR...

WHEN CAN WE HAVE MASS IN CHURCH AGAIN?

Our parish has offered the Eucharist in four different settings to meet the needs of our community: indoor, outdoor, drive-in, and live-streamed. Based on our recent attendance data, many parishioners seem to prefer either the outdoor or drive-in celebration if they have a choice. It's similar in other parishes. The drive-in liturgy is helpful to parents with small children, and easy for those who would like to join us without the need for reservation.


The drive-in Mass at 11:00 am on Easter Sunday drew 180+ people (in about 80 vehicles) - double the typical number of in-car participants in past weeks. Many were happy to be there on Easter Sunday. It was also an opportunity to invite passers-by to our church. That's part of the church mission: to invite more people to our Lord, not simply to minister to those in our community. The drive-in Mass is now back to 5:00 pm on Saturdays.

We all want to go back to church for the Eucharistic celebration. Yet, Worner Hall at this point is our preference for several reasons: better airflow and ventilation, greater seating capacity, easy chair arrangements, and simple sanitization, etc. At the same time, we are prepared to offer the Mass in church when the time is right (if vaccinations pick up pace and the infection rate is down).

We are grateful to our faithful volunteers who help with the check-in and sanitizing, and the dedicated Parish Pandemic Task Force. The team meets every week to ensure that we are prepared for constant changes during this pandemic. God bless them for their service.

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER APRIL 18, 2021



The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way, and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of the bread.

—Luke 24:35-48

FULFILLMENT

It is interesting that during the Easter season, when we do not hear a reading from the Old Testament, it becomes so important. This is particularly true today. Peter's speech begins with a prayer formula familiar to Jews: "The God of Abraham . . ." (Acts 3:13). It likewise contains the potent phrases "Holy and Righteous One" and "mouth of all the prophets" (3:14, 18). Peter was stating in no uncertain terms that the law, psalms, and prophets had been fulfilled in Christ.

This is reinforced by Jesus himself in the Gospel passage, when he states that everything in the scriptures (to the early Christians "the scriptures" were what we call the Old Testament) had to be fulfilled. Above all, Jesus and Peter both emphasize that we are witnesses to all of this, and are sent forth to bear witness to it in the world.

The Latin Missa, from which our word "Mass" comes, means "sent" (as in "mission"). As we leave Mass today, let us remember to be witnesses to all that has been fulfilled in the risen Christ.

Easter is not a day but a season, a season lasting from Easter Sunday through Pentecost. Records show that as far back as the third century, Christians were celebrating the Resurrection for 50 days. Why 50 days? Some believe that 50 represents seven weeks of seven days (seven equals Biblical perfection) plus one day: perfection plus! More probably Easter was superimposed on the Jewish spring festival which took place during the 50 days after Passover. It became the Church's longest season because Christians believed that Christ's Resurrection was too big and too important for just one day's celebration.

NOT WHAT WAS EXPECTED

Have you ever waited for something for so long you began to think it might never happen? The Israelites had waited for centuries for the coming of the Messiah. Yet when Jesus, the long-awaited Anointed One came, many failed to believe in him. He wasn't what they expected.

The Messiah was supposed to be a strong, powerful commander of armies, not humble, compassionate, and suffering. 
